We are extremely grateful to have welcomed Dr. Joe Jones to CCU as the new Prison Chaplain. Dr. Jones comes to CCU with a wealth of experience across multiple areas of ministry. We thought it best to let Chaplain Jones introduce himself in his own words:

You may have heard the adage: "the need is the call." I have known about this great need for ministry in the prisons and support for ex-offenders after their release. I directly served this need for about 14 years before committing to a life in higher education, preparing students to be light in these dark areas, offering hope where there is so much hopelessness, and extending the forgiveness that God gives those who would seek Him in their bondage of unforgiveness.

I am humbled by the opportunity to serve as light with others in Christ who are ready to share the Life that God gives to those who seek Him.

I am amazed at how desperate for the Word and Prayer the men and women we are serve are in their recognition of failure and hopelessness. I have been in ministry for many decades but seldom have I encountered such desperate desires for prayer and hearing the scriptures. This life-giving service makes God's Word alive in that whatever we sow, we shall reap.

I want to invite you to walk with us to sow into this work with your time, resources, gifts, and most of all, your love. This work is a call to wash the feet of those most identify as unworthy. Washing these feet remind us of how unworthy we are of the cleansing power of God in us.

We want to invite you to see Christ in every person, to offer a cup of cold water, food, clothing, or a visit to those in need. Our Matthew 25.40 team is made up of people like you and me who recognize the Imago Dei in others and offer that 'cup of cold water' through giving to CCU monthly.

Monthly giving helps provide stability not only for non-profits like CCU; but it provides stability for those who find themselves in a position of need. Warmth in Action

A Warm Culture is different than a Cold Culture. While we have faced some intensely cold days during January, we are not talking about the weather. We are talking about culture -- the ethos and spirit of a community when it comes to possessions. In Acts 2 and Acts 4, we witnessed the early church (existing in a Warm Culture) respond with a type of generosity that is not typical for much of Western Culture today. People sold and gave freely to one another to ensure that all were cared for. While that might not be the norm in Western Culture, we have had a front row seat to it here in Harrisburg.

In the face of tragedy at Tent City down at PennDOT, we witnessed you, our neighbors, respond with love, passion, and action. Organizations rallied together to provide a Memorial Service. Groups and individuals worked tirelessly to provide not only alternative methods of heat, but emergency measures to those whose homes are made of tent and tarp.

Then bitterly cold temperatures arrived and once again, you responded with your time and energy. Churches and organizations opened their doors during the cold, and within hours, volunteers began to sign up to provide support, and donations arrived. You, the beloved community, responded with warmth and provided warmth for over 200.

David Botero, a CCU Volunteer, shares, "There is PURPOSE in all that we as volunteers do." Volunteering across our city creates a transformative environment where we experience grace and change. At CCU, we desire for our volunteers to serve out of who they are and in ways that provide the assurance that they are fulfilling their purpose.
